

When Should I Call My Provider?

If you experience any of the following symptoms, please contact us at 678-775-0600.

- ❖ Temperature (fever) over 101
- ❖ Headache that is not relieved by Tylenol
- ❖ Visual changes-blurred vision or spots in front of your eyes
- ❖ Epigastric pain-upper right abdomen
- ❖ Severe swelling of face and hands
- ❖ If your baby is not moving or moving much less than usual
- ❖ Blood in your urine
- ❖ Vaginal bleeding (like a period or more)
- ❖ If you think your water has broken
- ❖ Labor pains
- ❖ Severe nausea or vomiting. If you cannot keep food or fluid down for 24 hours
- ❖ Preterm contractions-(these are contractions before 36 weeks). More than 6 uterine contractions in an hour. Less than 6 an hour is normal
- ❖ Term contractions (contractions at 36-37 weeks or more). Contractions every 5 minutes, lasting 60 seconds, for two hours.
